

Landscape of HPV Self-collection Webinar Series

The American Cancer Society (ACS) National Cervical Cancer Roundtable will kick off a three-part educational webinar series on self-collection for cervical cancer screening at 1 p.m. ET Thursday, October 30, 2025. The series is designed for federally qualified health centers and safety-net health systems. The series will provide a foundational overview of self-collection, including available testing options and devices and current clinical guidelines.
