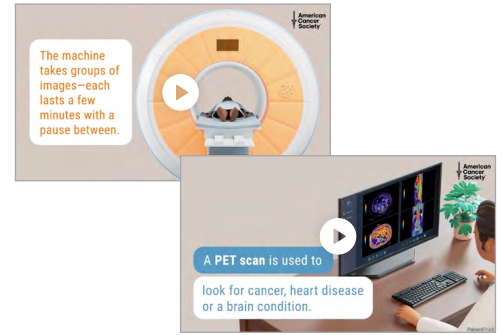
Helping Patients and Caregivers Understand Subcutaneous Therapy

How to Prepare for an MRI and What is a PET Scan? outline what imaging tests are, how they work, and what preparations should be made before each test. Imaging tests can be used in many ways, including looking for cancer, finding out how far it has spread, and helping determine if cancer treatment is working. 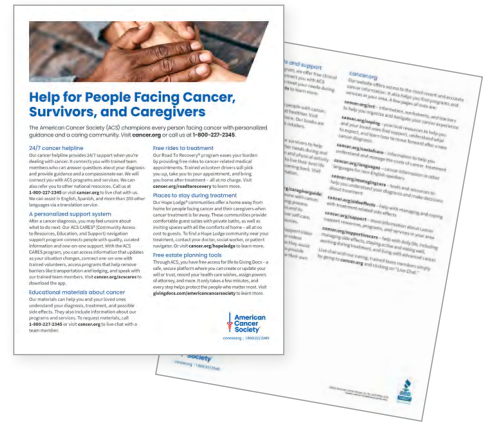

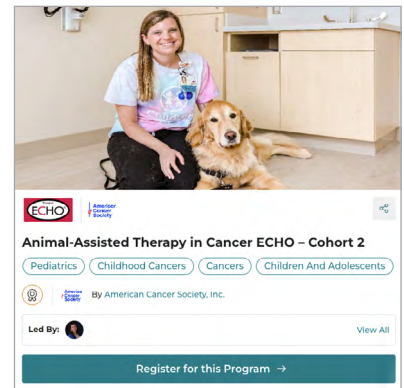
Upcoming ACS ECHO Programs

Animal-assisted Therapy in Cancer ECHO - Cohort 2

Join ACS for the Animal-assisted Therapy in Cancer ECHO - Cohort 2 program beginning Thursday, June 11, 2026. The six-month program will emphasize the therapeutic benefits of animal-assisted therapy, particularly with facility dogs and their child life specialist handlers, in addressing the psychosocial needs of children and teens with cancer. Each monthly session will last for an hour.

Long-term Survivorship ECHO

Join ACS beginning June 11, 2026, for the Long-term Survivorship ECHO program. The goal of the six-month program is to equip healthcare professionals with the knowledge and skills necessary to effectively address the complex and evolving long-term needs of people with cancer. The target audience for the program is multidisciplinary care teams, inclusive of oncology and primary care, that deliver supportive care for patients living with and beyond cancer. Each monthly session will last for an hour.
